17th April 2026 (Saturday) has been designated as a reserve date to address any potential extreme weather conditions that may arise.

Eligible candidates who hold a Fellowship in Otolaryngology, Associate Fellowship or Membership of one of the Royal Colleges of Great Britain and Ireland and Membership of the Hong Kong College of Otorhinolaryngologists, who have completed at least 36 months of accredited higher training in Otorhinolaryngology can proceed to sit for this Written Examination.

The Fee for this Written Examination is HKD9,000

IMPORTANT NOTE FOR CANDIDATES:

Eligible candidates are responsible for ensuring that their application form and all necessary supporting documents are submitted to the College Secretariat of the Hong Kong College of Otorhinolaryngologists by the specified deadline. Applications that are late or incomplete (including those with insufficient postage) will not be accepted, and no exceptions will be made for postal or other delays. The Hong Kong College of Otorhinolaryngologists retains the authority to cancel the examination if there are not enough candidates.

Effective from 2027, all candidates must successfully pass Written Examination, which consists of two Single Best Answer papers, in order to gain eligibility to proceed to Exit Examination, the clinical component of the examination.
